

Meeting Notes
Neighborhood Shelter Action Group
6/9/2015

In attendance: Gail Promboin, Greg Harms, Jeff Hoffmeyer, Jack Gipple, Officer David Kaufman (BPD)

Officer Kaufman, the Boulder Police Department's Community Outreach Officer, discussed how north Boulder residents can, and should respond when they encounter problems with the homeless population. He also handed out his personal contact information in case traditional communication channels at the PD do not work.

Trash concerns on Shelter property were discussed. The one incident that was brought up was an isolated case as the Shelter staff walk the property every day to ensure cleanliness.

Trash in the swale north of the Shelter was discussed. Greg received a call of concern from a resident north of the Shelter. The Shelter has contracted with Ready to Work to periodically clean the area.

Greg announced that, starting in the fall, Bridge House will bring some of their Resource Center services to the Shelter three mornings a week. This will add services such as job connections, addiction groups, Veteran's services and parole services to the Shelter. No significant impact on the neighborhood is expected.

Greg also announced that the Shelter is working on a new strategic plan. Nothing in the new plan is anticipated to impact the local area.

Updates to the plans for the Armory were also discussed.

The NSAG will take July and August off and meet again in September.
