1. Quick recap on current NSAG members. We do still want to find at least one more residential member from the Holiday Neighborhood.
  2. Greg reminded all that the Shelter opened for the winter emergency season on October 1. He highlighted that we are seeing regular turn-aways earlier in the season than normal.
  3. Greg gave an updated on the woman seen wandering about North Boulder. They are trying to find her some help, especially before the weather turns worse. There were questions about how this ends. Greg's comments was that it depends on her interest in getting help. Short term, Boulder Police can hold her to protect her from severe weather events. Reaching out by the community is viewed as positive.
  4. Greg revisited the neighborhood concern about trash in the ditch north of the Shelter. Working with the City, they did get the grass cut which reduces some of the trash. Greg is working with the City and County on a longer term plan.
  5. There will be an Master HOA meeting for the Dakota Ridge area on Thursday November 12. Greg had hoped to have Officer Kaufman, the Boulder PD public outreach officer, join him but his schedule didn't allow it. Greg is hoping to coordinate a separate meeting with the two parties in the near future.
  6. Greg announced the scheduling of the annual 1175 Lee Hill meeting with Boulder Housing Partners (BHP). This will be on December 10. More details will be coming.
  7. Monday November 9 was the first day of the Resource Center being available at the Boulder Shelter. Greg reported about 20 people were available to take advantage of services with 4 of those being non-residence of the Shelter. Currently, clients can work with representatives handling Clinica, ID issues, employment, and transportation.

Gail P. asked for continued tracking of the hours that the Resource Center is available and the numbers for participation.

8. In related news, Greg reported that Bridge House had handed off day shelter responsibilities to BOHO as of November 2. The Homeless Collaborative is working with downtown faith organizations to provide rotating coverage over 6 days. Currently, there are 2 churches with Bridge House continuing to provide access to their Carriage House for 3 days each week.
